As part of our mission action planning (MAP) we decided we wanted to make our church and our worship more accessible, welcoming and participatory.

READINGS

Epiphany tells of Christ's true nature being revealed so that we might catch a glimpse of the divine among us: in strangers (the Magi), in the everyday (the water of baptism), in joy & celebration (the wedding at Cana) & (today's readings) in the transforming power of God's word.

Nehemiah 8: 1-3, 5-6, 8-10 returned from exile, the people gather & ask the prophet to read the scriptures to them: they are moved to tears. The prophet tells them not be sorrowful but instead to rejoice & throw a feast — a feast which must include everyone, even those too poor to buy meat. For when the word of God is taken to heart by the people they will be transformed & their lives together will begin to reflect the life of the kingdom of God.

Luke 4:14-21 The spirit of the Lord sends Jesus to Nazareth where he reads from the scriptures to the gathered people. He reads from Isaiah that the spirit of the Lord has anointed him: chosen him, appointed him for a task: the task of bringing in the kingdom by changing the lives of God's people.
