## READINGS

### Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9

Keeping the law is important but not for its own sake: the law brings life, not as a reward from God earned by keeping the rules but because it puts mercy and justice at the heart of our human relationships.

### Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

Jesus offends the law-abiding religious of his day by accusing them of keeping the externals of the law whilst their hearts remain untouched by the values the law embodies. This passage comes immediately after the passage in which the Samaritan woman begs for her daughter to be healed: she is technically unclean yet her heart is clean because her actions are driven by the care and concern of another. **If our piety separates us from others it also separates us from God**
