READINGS

Daniel 7: 1-3,15-18 Daniel's vision about the nature of worldly power confuses and troubles him. Like us he cannot understand why terror and injustice appear to rule the earth but he is assured that the Holy Ones will inherit the kingdom, that ultimately earthly power will not prevail. The identity of these "Holy Ones" is explored a little in Luke:

Luke 6:20-31 Jesus claims that those who are blessed/happy are the losers in terms of earthly powers: those who do not have power or privilege, status or security. But the blessed, the Holy Ones, are not just the victims of the world's injustice and inequality but rather those who take a stand against worldly power by living out the kingdom of God: exercising the power given to them to love, to forgive, to daily live in solidarity with the poor and the weak and commit in a myriad of tiny ways to daily living in justice and mercy. Some Holy Ones aka Saints are called to live out the struggle for justice and mercy on the public stage most of us are called to live it out quietly each day: loving those who hate us and doing good to those who oppose us. In this way all of us affirm our identity as saints and our place in that great cloud of witnesses that is the communion of saints.
