

### All Souls Service


Commemoration of the faithful departed

## READINGS

### John 6:25-35

The people ask Jesus to give them a sign: the sign they are looking for is a free lunch. They recall their time in the wilderness when they ate miraculous food for which they did not have to work, manna from heaven. The time in the wilderness reminds the people of their radical dependence on God – a time when all they needed was provided for them. But Jesus tells them that this is not enough – they are not called to be dependents forever, they are called to work for the food that endures. A loaf of bread will feed them for a while but soon they will be hungry again. Opening their hearts and minds to God will empower them to build a society in which no one is hungry, when everyone's needs are met.
