READINGS

Luke 17:5-10

The disciples make a perfectly reasonable request: give us more faith. In reply Jesus tells them that they don’t need it. They don’t need a big heap of faith, faith isn’t something you grow like a seedling until it is strong enough to plant out, or save up until you have enough; It is something you use, you give away, you live. Faith allows us to do the next right thing, like the servant Jesus describes going about his daily tasks. Faith does not answer all the questions and dispel all the suffering, it “is not a light that scatters all our darkness but a lamp that guides our steps in the night and suffices for the journey”, Pope Francis. We need just the tiniest amount, a mustard seed’s worth enough to just show up and God will do the rest.
